COUNTY PROGRAM DELETIONS: No Change

DATES: No changes

RATES:

- All rates are now published on the FCI-35 Coverage and Rates Table at the 65% coverage level.
- APPLES: Brown, Crawford, Door, and Richland: -10%; Chippewa: +10%.
- CRANBERRIES: Jackson, Juneau, Monroe, and Wood: -10%; Lincoln and Oneida: +10%.
- FORAGE PRODUCTION APH & GRP: Varying rate changes noted. Please check county documents.
- MINT: No change to Jefferson; Dane, Marquette, and Walworth have rate increases of 17% for winter coverage types and 8% increase for types without winter coverage.
- NURSERY: No changes
- WHEAT: Reference rates moved toward target rates.

STATEMENTS:

- Added statements to the Special Provisions for all crops referring to organic production.
- WHEAT:
 - Changed statement on Special Provisions that limits the Late Planting Period in dual counties so it applies only to fall planted WHEAT not covered by the winter coverage endorsement.
 - Quality statement on the Special Provisions has changes to discount factors.

PRACTICES: No changes

TYPES: No changes

T-YIELDS:

- APPLES reviewed but no changes made.
- CRANBERRIES southern counties increased 5.5%, northern counties down 6%.
- MINT reviewed but no changes made.

MAPS/SUPPLEMENTS: No Change

OTHER:

- FCI-35: Added organic rate factors for certified organic and transitional acreage.
- APPLES: Changes to Fresh Fruit Options. Now shown as Fresh Option on the FCI-35s.
