SUBJECT: 2013 and 2014 Crop Year County Crop Program Expansion

BACKGROUND:

The Federal Crop Insurance Corporation (FCIC) has expanded the number of counties where certain crops are insurable for the 2013 and 2014 crop year. The following attachment, ***2013 EXPANSION OF PILOT AND EXISTING PROGRAMS and 2014 EXPANSION OF EXISTING PROGRAMS*** lists the 2013 and 2014 crop year fall and spring crop expansion by crop, state, and county for permanently-established (non-pilot) programs and pilot programs.

The Risk Management Agency is continuing the policy of expanding crop insurance programs, particularly where interest by producers has been shown, which is consistent with the Administration's policy of providing producers the opportunity and responsibility for managing their own risk for their farming operations.

ACTION:

Insurance providers should advise producers of the expanded county crop programs for which the sales closing date has not passed in their counties for the 2013 crop year to allow producers the opportunity to purchase crop insurance. This can be done by contacting individual producers, producer groups, or using newsletters, magazines, newspapers, etc.
