2013 COMMODITY INSURANCE FACT SHEET

Potatoes

Arizona

Crop Insured

Russet and all other potatoes varieties that are grown on irrigated fields may be insurable. Potatoes planted with certified seed for harvest and human consumption may be insurable.

Counties Available

Potatoes are insurable in Maricopa and Pinal counties. Potatoes in other counties may be insurable by written agreement if specific criteria are met. Contact an agent for more details.

Causes of Loss

Adverse weather conditions¹
Failure of Irrigation water supply²
Fire
Insects³
Plant disease³
Wildlife

Important Dates¹

Sales Closing	November 30
Final Planting Date (Pinal)	March 10
Final Planting Date (Maricopa)	February 28
Acreage Report Due	April 30

Insurance Period

Insurance begins when the potatoes are planted and ends at the earliest of:

- 1) Total destruction of the crop;
- 2) Harvest of the crop;
- 3) Final adjustment of a loss;
- 4) Abandonment of the crop; or
- 5) No later than July 25.

Coverage Levels and Premium Subsidies

Coverage levels range from 50 to 75 percent of your average yield. Unit measure is hundredweight (cwt.). For example, an average potato yield of 400 cwt. per acre would result in a 200 cwt. per acre guarantee at the 50 percent coverage level. Producers may select 55 to 100 percent of a price announced by USDA.

Catastrophic Risk Protection (CAT) coverage is fixed at 50 percent of your average yield and 55 percent of the price election.

Price Election

The price used to calculate your premium or indemnity.

Potatoes	\$10.00 p	er cwt.

Cost of Crop Insurance

CAT coverage has an application fee of \$300 with 100 percent of the premiums being subsidized. Higher coverage levels are subsidized at lower rates though USDA pays at least 50 percent of the premium. Loss Example

Assume russets at an average yield of 400 cwt. per acre, winter-planted in Pinal county, 75-percent coverage level, and 100-percent share.

	400	Cwt. per acre average yield
X	.75	Coverage level percentage
	300	Cwt. per acre guarantee
-	250	Cwt. per acre actually produced
	50	Cwt. per acre loss
<u>x</u> \$	10.00	Price election ¹
	\$ 500	Gross indemnity per acre

¹Natural perils such as hail, frost, freeze, wind, drought, and excess moisture.

²If caused by an insured peril during the insurance period.
