# **Processing Tomatoes**

# California

# **Crop Insured**

All varieties of processing tomatoes are insurable if they are acceptable according to and grown under a processor contract. The tomatoes must be irrigated. Producers must insure all their contracted processing tomatoes in a county.

#### **Counties Available**

Processing tomatoes are insurable in Colusa, Contra Costa, Fresno, Glenn, Kern, Kings, Madera, Merced, Sacramento, San Benito, San Joaquin, Santa Clara, Solano, Stanislaus, Sutter, Tulare and Yolo counties. Processing tomatoes in other counties may be insurable by written agreement if specific criteria are met. Contact an agent for more details.

Failure of irrigation water supply<sup>2</sup>

## **Important Dates**

Sales Closing	January 31
Final Planting	June 15
Acreage Reporting	July 15

## **Insurance Period**

You must apply for coverage with a crop insurance agent before January 31 to insure the tomatoes you plan to plant and harvest that year. Coverage begins when the tomatoes are planted and ends the earlier of:

- 1) When the contract is fulfilled;
- 2) Harvesting ends;
- 3) Acreage is abandoned; or
- 4) October 20.

# **Coverage Levels and Premium Subsidies**

The guarantee is the amount of production you choose, measured in tons of tomatoes delivered to a processor. Individual insurance amounts are based on your production history. Your approved average yield is calculated from 4 to 10 years of production records you provide to an insurance agent. You can choose a level of coverage from 50 to 75 percent of your approved average yield and 55 to 100 percent of a price announced by USDA. Catastrophic Risk Protection (CAT) coverage is based on 50 percent of your approved yield and 55 percent of the price.

#### **Price Election**

The price used to determine your premium and indemnity.

Conventional	\$69.40 per ton
Organic	\$104.10 per ton

#### **Cost of Crop Insurance**

CAT coverage has an application fee of \$300 with 100 percent of the premiums being subsidized. Higher coverage levels are subsidized at lower rates though USDA pays at least 50 percent of the premium. For more detailed information about coverage and

# **Loss Example**

Assume 70-percent coverage, 100-percent price election of \$69 40 per ton, an average yield of 40 tons per acre, one basic unit, and 100 percent share.

\$ 555.20	Gross indemnity per acre
x 69.40	Price election *
8	Tons per acre loss
<u>- 20</u>	Tons per acre actually produced
28	Tons per acre guarantee
<u>x .70</u>	Tons level
40	Tons per acre average yield
