Sugar Beets California

Crop Insured

All sugar beets are insurable in county if grown under a contract with a processor for processing as sugar.

Counties Available

Sugar beets are insurable in Imperial County. Sugar Beets in other counties may be insurable by written agreement if specific criteria are met. Contact an agent for more details.

Causes of Loss

You are protected against the following:

- Adverse weather conditions; •
- Failure of irrigation water supply, if caused by an • insured peril during the insurance year;
- Fire, unless weeds and undergrowth are not • controlled;
- Insects or plant disease, but not damage due to insufficient or improper application of control measures; or
- Wildlife, unless recommended wildlife control • measures have not been taken.

Insurance Period

Coverage begins when the sugar beets are planted and ends at the earliest of:

- Total destruction of the crop on the unit; •
- Harvest of the crop in the unit; •
- Final adjustment of a loss on a unit; ٠
- July 15 for Imperial county; or
- Delivered production equals amount of contracted ٠ production.

Coverage Levels and Premium Subsidies

Individual amounts of insurance are based on a your production history. Your approved, average yield is calculated from 4 to 10 years of production records provided to an insurance agent. Coverage levels range from 50 to 75 percent of your approved yield. Crop insurance premiums are subsidized as shown in the following table. For example, if you choose the 65percent coverage level, your premium share would be 41 percent of the base premium.

Catastrophic Risk Protection (CAT) coverage is fixed at 50 percent of your approved yield and 55 percent of the price election. CAT is 100-percent subsidized with no premium cost to you. There is, however, an administrative fee of \$300 per crop per county, regardless of the acreage.

Price Election

The price used to calculate your premium and indemnity.

Sugar Beets \$58.55 per ton

Loss Example

Assume, an average yield of 40 tons per acre, 75-percent coverage level, irrigated, and one basic unit, 100-percent share.
