Onions Utah

Crop Insured

White, red, and yellow onions are insurable if:

- They are for fresh use; and
- Premium rates have been established in the county.

Counties Available

Onions are insurable in Box Elder, Davis, and Weber counties. The crop may be insurable in other counties by written agreement if specific criteria are met. Contact an insurance agent for more details.

Causes of Loss

You are protected against the following:

- Adverse weather conditions;
- Failure of irrigation water supply, if caused by an insured peril during the insurance year;
- Fire;
- Insects or plant disease, but not damage due to insufficient or improper application of control measures; or
- Wildlife.

Insurance Period

Coverage usually begins when the crop is planted. The insurance period ends with the earliest occurrence of one of the following:

- Removal of the onions from the field;
- 14 days after lifting or digging;
- August 31 for all non-storage onions; or
- October 15 for all storage onions.

Coverage Levels and Premium Subsidies

Individual insurance amounts are based on your past production and planted acres. You will be asked to provide 4 to 10 years of actual yield history that will be used to calculate your average yield. Coverage levels range from 50 to 75 percent of your approved yield. Crop insurance premiums are subsidized as shown in the following table. For example, if you choose the 65-percent coverage level, your premium share would be 41 percent of the base premium.

Item	Percent					
Coverage Level	50	55	60	65	70	75
Premium Subsidy	67	64	64	59	59	55
Your Premium Share	33	36	36	41	41	45

Catastrophic Risk Protection (CAT) coverage is fixed at 50 percent of your approved yield and 55 percent of the price election. CAT is 100-percent subsidized with no premium cost to you. There is, however, an administrative fee of \$300 per crop per county, regardless of the acreage.

Price Election

The price used to calculate your premium and indemnity.

Onions.....\$7.00 per cwt.

Late and Prevented Planting

Coverage that provides reduced protection on acreage that is planted late, or that cannot be planted by the final planting date or within the late planting period.

Loss Example

Assume 75-percent coverage, 100-percent price election of \$7.00 cwt., an average yield of 320 cwt., and 100-percent share.

- 320 Cwt. per acre average yield
- <u>x 0.75</u> Coverage level
 - 240 Cwt. per acre guarantee
- <u>- 100</u> Cwt. per acre actually produced
- 140 Cwt. per acre loss
- <u>x 7.00</u> Price election

\$980 Gross indemnity per acre
