April 15 Sales Closing Date Near For Crop Insurance in Florida

VALDOSTA, Ga., April 1, 2014 — The USDA's Risk Management Agency (RMA) reminds farmers of the **April 15** sales closing date for crop insurance in Florida. This sales closing date applies to crop insurance policies for citrus trees and fruit. The sales closing date is the last day to buy a new policy or change an existing policy's coverage level.

Citrus Trees:

Avocado trees – Miami-Dade County Carambola trees – Lee and Miami-Dade counties Grapefruit trees – Hendry, Lee, Martin and Palm Beach counties Lemon trees – Hendry, Lee, Martin and Palm Beach counties Lime trees – Hendry, Lee and Miami-Dade counties Mango trees – Miami-Dade County Orange trees – Hendry, Martin and Palm Beach counties All other citrus trees (tangerines, tangelos and murcotts only) – Hendry, Martin and Palm Beach counties

Citrus Fruit:

Grapefruit – Hendry, Martin and Palm Beach counties Lemons – Hendry, Martin and Palm Beach counties Limes – Lee and Miami-Dade counties Mandarins/tangerines, oranges, tangelos and tangors – Brevard, Broward, Charlotte, Citrus, Collier, De Soto, Glades, Hardee, Hendry, Hernando, Highlands, Hillsborough, Indian River, Lake, Lee, Manatee, Marion, Martin, Miami-Dade, Okeechobee, Orange, Osceola, Palm Beach, Pasco, Polk, Sarasota, Seminole, St Lucie and Volusia counties
