*Season:

Season is determined from research information that rates variety ripening as "Days Before Elberta" (DBE) or "Days After Bloom" (DAB). The following criteria were used to assign a season:

<u>Season</u>	Days Before Elberta	Days After Bloom
Early Mid	> 40	< 85 85 - 105
Late	≤ 19 to after Elberta (≥ -19)	> 105

For example:

Durbin is rated as 36 DBE (-36) and is categorized as a mid-season variety. Carolina Red is rated as 46 DBE (-46) and is categorized as an early-season variety. Sunfre is rated as 85 DAB and is categorized as a mid-season variety.
