2011 Commodity Insurance Fact Sheet

Mycotoxin

Illinois Indiana Michigan Ohio

Mycotoxins are fungal metabolites that are toxic when consumed by animals or humans. They can accumulate in small grains and other feed crops in the field. They can also accumulate in grain during transportation and during improper storage favorable for the growth of the toxin-producing fungus.

If you suspect your insured crop has mycotoxin, contact your crop insurance agent before* you put the grain in storage or deliver it for sale. Your insurance provider will obtain samples for testing and submit them to an approved testing facility for mycotoxin. The impact of high levels of mycotoxin on producers varies from a discount in price to the requirement to destroy the grain.

High levels of mycotoxin may be an insurable cause of loss. Insureds should notify their insurance agent before* harvesting and/or placing harvested grain in storage if their grain is suspected of containing mycotoxin. Refer to the applicable Special Provisions of Insurance for the most current policy on testing.

*Sample requirements for grain contaminated with *Vomitoxin* state that samples MAY be obtained from a storage structure; therefore, if a sample is infected with vomitoxin, it DOES NOT need to be collected before putting the grain into on farm storage.

Following is a list of certified testing facilities for mycotoxin in **Illinois, Indiana, Ohio, and Michigan** according to the Grain Inspection, Packers and Stockyard Administration (GIPSA). This is not a complete list and should only serve as a guide. To be an “approved testing facility” for crop insurance purposes, the following criteria must be met. Testing facilities not listed which meet the criteria can be considered “approved testing facilities.” Consult with your crop insurance provider for more information.

Criteria for Approved Testing Facilities

1. A certified facility must be able to perform quantitative tests on grain, itemizing results in parts per million (ppm) and parts per billion (ppb). Test kits used must be certified by GIPSA.
2. The facility must be a recognized commercial, government, or university testing lab that uses industry-recognized sample sizes, equipment, and procedures for testing mycotoxin.
3. The facility must be a disinterested testing facility unless RMA issues a written authorization to waive this requirement.
