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Crop Insurance Deadline Nears for Indiana Apple Growers

SPRINGFIELD, Ill., November 13, 2013 – The USDA's Risk Management Agency (RMA) reminds Indiana apple growers interested in buying a new federal crop insurance policy, or making changes to an existing policy, to do so by the November 20 sales closing date. Apple insurance is available in Clark, Elkhart, Fountain, Hancock, Hendricks, LaPorte, Marion, Morgan and Spencer counties.

Brian Frieden, Director of RMA's Springfield Regional Office, urges producers to contact a crop insurance agent for details. Agents can help new producers determine which policy works best for their operation and review existing coverage to ensure the policy meets their needs.

"Crop insurance protects growers from many different types of risk. For example, apple producers can be protected from losses resulting from frost, drought or summer storms," said Frieden.

Crop insurance is sold and delivered solely through private crop insurance agents. Contact a local crop insurance agent for more information about the program.
