Actuarial Document Changes Released for Iowa, Minnesota, and Wisconsin

SAINT PAUL, Minn., Nov. 25, 2013 – USDA's Risk Management Agency (RMA) announced today that actuarial documents for 2014 are now available for all 11/30 commodities and insurance plans. RMA offers a summary of updates through release of 11/30 actuarial filing update sheets. These update sheets can be found at www.rma.usda.gov/aboutrma/fields/mn_rso/actuarial/index.html.

Producers, insurance agents, and insurance company employees are encouraged to use these resources as a reference for important 2014 insurance changes. These update sheets can be used to find information on program expansion and deletion, date changes, map changes, and updates made to the crop special provisions in the Saint Paul Region, which includes Iowa, Minnesota, and Wisconsin.
