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Crop Insurance Deadline Nears in North Carolina

RALEIGH, N.C., Oct. 20, 2014 — USDA's Risk Management Agency (RMA) reminds North Carolina apple, blueberry, grapes and peach growers that the final date to apply for crop insurance on next year's crop is November 20, 2014. Current policyholders who wish to make changes to their existing policies also have until November 20 to do so.

Price elections for 2015 will be \$13.35 per bushel for fresh apples and \$4.15 for processing apples. Apple Varietal Groups A, B, and C have been added for the 2015 crop year. See your crop insurance agent for apple varieties and prices applicable to each varietal group. 2015 price election for blueberries is: \$1.25 per pound. Grape prices for non vinifera varieties vary from \$250 to \$860 per ton, depending on the variety. The price for muscadine grapes is \$545 per ton. Vinifera grapes varieties may be insurable by individual written agreement if certain criteria are met. Peach price elections are: \$20 per bushel for fresh peaches, and \$6.25 for processing peaches. Crop insurance provides coverage against production losses due to damage caused by natural perils and adverse weather conditions such as hail, wind, frost, and drought.

Your actual amount of coverage will be determined from your actual yields and the protection level you select. Fruit producers should consider making crop insurance an essential part of their overall risk management plan to help protect their operations from financial loss.
