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Crop Insurance Deadline Nears in New York

Producers with Insurable Spring-Seeded Crops Need to Make Insurance Decisions Soon

RALEIGH, N.C., March 2, 2016 - USDA's Risk Management Agency (RMA) reminds New York producers that the final date to apply for crop insurance coverage on most insurable spring-planted crops is March 15. Current policyholders who wish to make changes to their existing policies also have until the March 15 sales closing date to do so.

Crop insurance provides protection against crop production losses due to natural perils, such as drought or excessive moisture. Coverage is available for cabbage, corn, dry beans, forage seeding, fresh market beans, fresh market sweet corn, grain sorghum, green peas, potatoes, processing beans, processing sweet corn, processing tomatoes, soybeans, spring barley, an spring oats in New York. Coverage is also available for revenue losses caused by a change in the harvest price from the projected price for spring barley, corn, grain sorghum, and soybeans.

Producers are encouraged to visit their crop insurance agent soon to learn specific details for the 2016 crop year. Crop insurance is sold and delivered solely through private crop insurance agents. Producers can use the RMA <u>Cost Estimator</u> to get a premium amount estimate of their insurance needs online.
