## 2013 COMMODITY INSURANCE FACT SHEET

# **Barley with Winter Protection**

Idaho, Oregon, Washington

## **Crop Insured**

All winter and spring types of **barley** planted for harvest as grain is insurable. You must have a share in the crop to insure it. The winter coverage endorsement provides additional protection for winter types. #### **Winter Coverage Endorsement**

Additional coverage is available under this endorsement for barley damaged between the time coverage begins and the spring-type final planting date. All eligible acreage of the crop must be insured. Whenever any winter barley is damaged during the insurance period and at least 20 acres or 20 percent of the acreage in the unit (whichever is less) does not have an adequate stand to produce at least 90 percent of the production guarantee for the acreage, you may:

- 1) Continue to care for the damaged crop;
- 2) Replant the acreage to an appropriate variety of the insured crop (if it is practical) and receive a replanting payment; or
- 3) Destroy the remaining crop and accept the appraised amount of production.

By accepting this winter coverage endorsement, the contract change, cancellation, and termination dates for wheat in the county will be applicable to your spring and winter barley.

#### **Counties Available**

Idaho – Ada, Canyon, Cassia, Elmore, Gem, Jerome, Minidoka, Nez Perce, Payette, and Twin Falls.

Oregon – Umatilla and Wasco counties Washington – Asotin, Klickitat, and Yakima. Winter barley coverage may be available in other counties by written agreement. Submit requests through your insurance agent to the Spokane Regional Office by September 30.

### **Optional Units**

Additional optional units may be established under this endorsement if each optional unit contains only initially-planted winter barley or only initially-planted spring barley.

### **Important Dates**

Sales Closing	September 30
Acreage Reporting	December 15
Final Planting	Varies by county
Cancellation Date	September 30

The dates above only apply if you choose the winter coverage endorsement for barley. Talk to your insurance agent for specific dates in your county.

#### **Eligible Varieties**

The winter coverage endorsement is only available for the cultivars listed below planted in the fall. Any cultivars not listed below must be approved in writing by the Federal Crop Insurance Corporation.
