SUBJECT: Emergency Loss Determinations for the 1999 Hurricane Damage in
North Carolina, South Carolina and Virginia

BACKGROUND:

The Risk Management Agency issued Bulletin No. MGR-99-038 to authorize emergency loss determinations to assist in the expeditious adjustment of losses and issuance of indemnity payments to insureds in the counties and states affected by Hurricane Floyd. Reports have been received that, for some tobacco warehouses located in the flooded areas, tobacco grade tickets showing the weight and grade no longer exist or are not legible. Bulletin No. MGR-99-038 provided the support price will be used to value such production if the grade tickets are not available. Requests to use other documentation to establish the amount and value of the tobacco production have been received.

ACTION:

Item 5) e) contained in MGR-99-038 is hereby amended to read:

- 5) For Tobacco
 - e) Account for all production weighed in at the warehouse but not sold as production to count and value such production at the support price unless the insured can establish, to the insurance provider's satisfaction, the amount and value of such tobacco from records such as grade tickets, sales bills,
