SUBJECT: 2001 Crop Year Additional Price Elections for Durum Wheat in Arizona and California

The Risk Management Agency (RMA) today announced the additional price election (often referred to as market price election) for the 2001 crop year for durum wheat in Arizona and California. The additional price represents the maximum price election for the crop year and is \$3.50 per bushel for durum wheat. This price election is available to all producers of durum wheat in Arizona and California who insure their 2001 crop at levels above catastrophic coverage. Price election choices must be made on or before the sales closing date for the crop in a county.

The established price election was \$2.80 per bushel for durum wheat. The amount of subsidy no longer is affected by a price election of less than 100 percent of the additional price due to changes made by the Agricultural Risk Protection Act of 2000. However, an increase in the price election may impact eligibility for exclusion of hail and fire since the Act requires additional coverage equal to a minimum 65 percent coverage level indemnified at 100 percent of the price election.

The price for catastrophic coverage is \$1.93 per bushel for durum wheat in Arizona and California.
